Out lesbian candidate challenges anti-equality pol

We just got word that Dr. Sara Orozco, a Needham psychologist and former Bay Windows contributor, will challenge Sen. Scott Brown, a Wrentham Republican, in the Norfolk, Bristol & Middlesex district this fall. Orozco is an openly gay mother of twins.

Brown won the seat in a 2004 special election after openly gay state Sen. Cheryl Jacques stepped down to take the helm of the Human Rights Campaign. With the departure of Jacques and openly gay state Sen. Jarrett Barrios last summer, the Senate has no openly gay legislators.

Will Orozco reverse that trend?

As a first-time candidate, Orozco likely faces an uphill climb in uprooting Brown. She'll no doubt receive strong support from marriage equality activists who would love to take out a notoriously anti-gay pol like Brown, who has consistently opposed pro-gay legislation and received financial backing from the likes of The Massachusetts Independent PAC for Working Families (MIPAC), the political action arm of the Massachusetts Family Institute.

However the race turns out, though, the campaign will likely challenge Brown's bounds of civility on LGBT issues. You'll recall that the senator

made headlines last year when he read aloud profanity-laced Facebook posts criticizing him for his opposition to marriage equality to a group of students at King Philip Regional High School. Brown justified using potty-mouth with a bunch of kids by saying that he was simply repeating what the students themselves had written about him and his daughter. Critics characterized him as undignified and a poor role model. And back in 2001 when Brown was a state representative and Jacques still held the Senate seat, he made headlines in the Boston Globe and beyond when he responded to the news Jacques and her partner Jenn Chrisler were expecting twins by observing that, "They're certainly not married. There's a difference of philosophy there. Are there two mothers there? Are they husband and wife? It's unusual for two women having a baby. It's just not normal, in terms of what's normal in today's society."

This from a guy who [posed nude for Cosmo and rhapsodized in an accompanying profile about women who are "tall, athletic and have longish hair and beautiful legs ... hmm, I'm getting excited!"](#) He also [waxed homoerotic about his unabashed nudity](#): "When you go to the beach you automatically seek out the best bodies, female and male," he said. "Why should it be different in a magazine?"

"We face enormous challenges, from strengthening our economy, to ensuring access to quality health care, to making our public schools the best that they can be. I will use my experience as a health care provider, a business owner, and a parent to identify common-sense solutions for the challenges we face."

"One important qualification for this job comes from my work as a psychologist, which has taught me to listen closely to people to help them find solutions to the problems that keep them up at night. I will bring that same gift for listening and shared problem-solving to the people I will serve."

Describing her commitment, Orozco said, "I feel that my accomplishments in life are the direct result of the opportunities offered to me through public education, women having equal access to athletics through Title IX, and through access to quality health care which may have saved my life when I was diagnosed with breast cancer ten years ago. And now I feel it is my turn to give back and help shape a state government of which we can all be proud."

"In the weeks ahead, I look forward to meeting voters across this district, and talking with them about the challenges that they and their families are facing. This will be a grassroots campaign focused on the needs of real people, and what we can do together to improve the quality of life in our
